

Kick or Treat



Pender County Parks and Recreation Kickball Tournament

Tournament Dates: October 23rd, 2021

Tournament Time:1pm-5pm

Deadline to register: October 21st at 5pm

Format: Single Elimination

Location: Hampstead Kiwanis Park

Fees: \$50 per team

Park Rules:

• No pets

• No tobacco products of any kind, e-cigs, vaping, etc. except in the parking lot.

• No alcohol

• No foul language

Players:

- All participants must be at least 14 years old prior to the first game.
- All players must wear sneakers or rubber cleats. Metal spikes are prohibited.
- All players must be on the roster.

Teams:

- Each roster is limited to 15 players, including manager and/or coaches.
- Each team has a captain who will be the point of contact for staff and/or other teams.
- Each team must field at least six and no more than nine players.
- An out is recorded for every missed player. Example: if you have eight players the 9th spot in the lineup is recorded as an automatic out.

Game:

- Each game shall last 7 innings or 50 minutes, whichever comes first. The clock starts at the time the game is scheduled.
- The team captains are responsible for keeping score during the game and reporting the results of the game to the staff.
- There is a 10 run per inning limit for all innings. No mercy rule.
- Game time is forfeit time. Teams must be prepared to play the game at the scheduled time.

Officiating:

- This event is intended to be a fun community tournament. There will be no officials.
- Teams will self-officiate and all players are expected to practice good sportsmanship.

Kicking:

- The kicking order should consist of at least 6 but no more than 9 players.
- Balls must be hit with the foot or the shin. If the kicked ball is above the knee it is a foul ball.
- There are no walks in this tournament. Each kicker will have three balls to put in play. If on the 3rd ball the player kicks a foul that will be an out.

Pitching:

- The pitcher will be from the kicking team.
- The pitcher is expected to avoid all contact with the ball after it is kicked into play.

• Pitching style is up to the pitcher but must be done with the hands.

Running and Scoring:

- Leading off the base and stealing bases are not allowed. A runner may advance once the ball is kicked.
- Any runner that is hindered by any fielder within the baseline, not making an active play for the ball, shall be safe at the base to which they were running.
- A line will be drawn in front of home plate. The kicker must not cross this line before making contact with the ball.
- A runner scores a point when they run through all the bases and return to the home plate.

Outs:

- A count of three strikes is an out. A strike is:
 - A pitch that is not kicked
 - o An attempted kick missed by the kicker
 - o A pitch that does not enter the kicking box
 - A pitch that is kicked and is a foul: Foul is considered any kicked ball that lands out of bounds before reaching 1st or 3rd base or a ball that is kicked above the knee.
- Any base runner who is contacted by the game ball while not on a base (thrown or tagged), unless contacted while overrunning first base from the kicking box.
 - o If a runner is hit in the head/neck with the ball, that runner will be considered safe at the base to which they were running.
- If the fielding team catches the ball after it has been kicked and before it hits the ground.
- If a runner overcomes and passes another runner, the passing runner is out.

Ties:

• When the game time limit is up and the result is a tie game, the winner will be determined by playing an additional inning with a two-out regulation. If there is not a winner after the additional inning, then the result of the game is a tie.

Weather Rule:

This event is weather dependent and will be subject to delay or cancelation. Lighting within 10 miles will delay the event for 30 minutes. If lightning strikes again within that 30-minute window, the clock will restart. If there are no other lightning strikes within 10 miles in that 30-minute window, play may continue. Heavy rain will likely cancel the event. The potential damage to the fields would also cause cancelation. Decisions relating to weather or field conditions are determined by Pender County Parks and Recreation.

Protests:

Pender County Parks & Recreation Officials must be told of a protest immediately before the next legal or illegal pitch is thrown so he/ she can tell the other manager. Please note that all rulings from Burgaw/Pender County Officials are final and no other action can be taken. Pender County management is empowered to resolve all issues and problems at their discretion. Pender County reserves the right to refuse services to any party for any reasonable cause.
